Delaware Valley's Knoblauch, Alfred's Brady and Union's Angiletta Highlight 2005 *Football Gazette East All-Region Team*

WESTMONT, Illinois --Middle Atlantic Conference Offensive Player of the Year, **Adam Knoblauch**, from Delaware Valley, the Saxons' leading tackler, **Brenton Brady** from Alfred and, Union's record-setting receiver, **Steve Angiletta**, headline a talented 2005 *Don Hansen's Football Gazette NCAA Division III East All-Region team*. Union's **John Audino**, who led the Dutchmen to the Liberty Conference title and the NCAA Div. III playoffs while finishing the season with an 11-1 record, was named Regional Coach of the Year.

Knoblauch earned Offensive Back of the Year honors, while Brady claimed the Defensive Linebacker of the Year Award and Angiletta was named the Offensive Receiver of the Year. Senior **Joe Scalice** from Ithaca earned Offensive Lineman of the Year accolades, while **Randy Tosh** from Rowan claimed the Defensive Lineman of the Year award. Widener's **Todd Fairlie** is the Defensive Back of the year and Special Teams Player of the Year honors go to **Adamis Gonzalez** from Western Connecticut State.

Knoblauch, a senior, from Tamaqua, Pennsylvania, is the 2005 MAC Offensive Player of the Year and a Gagliardi Trophy finalist. He became just the second D-III QB and sixth in college history to pass for more than 10,000 yards and rush for 1,000 yards in a career and finished second all-time in D-III in total offense (12,833) and fifth in passing (11,284). Knoblauch's achievements also place him in the top 10 in career passing TDs with 101, and now is the holder of 17 school records. He led the Dutchmen to back-to-back MAC titles and back-to-back trips to the NCAA quarterfinals. In 2005 he completed 246-of-414 passes (59.4-percent) for 3,307 yards and 29 touchdowns while rushing for 737 yards on 142 carries (5.2 average per carry) and scored 10 touchdowns.

Brady, a senior, from Rochester, New York, earned First Team all-Empire 8 honors for a third straight year. The Saxons' leading tackler finished the season with 98 tackles (61 solo). He had seven sacks (-47 yards), 12.5 tackles for loss (-61 yards), an interception (10-yard return), two blocked kicks and five pass breakups. His four forced fumbles led the conference and ranked fifth in the nation. Brady's 98 tackles gave him three straight years with at least 90 stops. Brady, the Saxons' short yardage back, had 277 yards rushing and a team-high 10 touchdowns, which ranks sixth in the conference. Brady is a three-time Empire 8 First Team All-Star (2003-05). He is a three-time First Team ECAC Northwest Region All-Star (2003, 2004 and 2005) and was the ECAC Northwest Region Player of the Year in 2004.

Angiletta, a junior, from Plantsville, New York, became the first Dutchmen receiver in history to record over 1,000 yards in a season. He had 1,612 receiving yards for this season. He holds the career record at Union with 2,841 receiving yards. Over the last five games, Angiletta had 795 yards on 53 catches, with eight touchdowns, an average of 15 yards per catch and 159 yards per game. He has records for catches in a season (99, breaking the mark of 74 set in 1965), yards in a season (he had 897 last year), and yards in a career (previous record was 1,750 set in 1992). Angiletta's totals for this season were 99 catches for 1,612 yards (16.3 yard average per catch) and scored 11 touchdowns. First Team Liberty League selection.

Scalice, a senior, from North Tonawanda, New York, earned all-America honors from the AFCA (first team), and AP (first team). A three-time Empire 8 all-star and two-time first-team selection (he earned second-team accolades as a sophomore), started 39 games at left guard over the past four seasons, including all 11 this fall. His play on the offensive line contributed to three single-season records this year and helped two different running backs post single-game efforts of at least 180 yards. Scalice was named Ithaca's Outstanding Lineman after the Lycoming game. As a junior he earned second-team all-region and first-team all-ECAC honors. He helped the USA to a 53-15 win in the 2005 Aztec Bowl played Dec. 17 in Toluca, Mexico. The team's 53 points set an Aztec Bowl record.

Tosh, a sophomore, from Columbia, New Jersey, is a 2005 First Team New Jersey Athletic Conference selection as well as the ECAC First Team Northwest honoree. He helped Rowan advance to the semi-finals of the NCAA Div. III playoffs, and an overall-mark of 11-2, as well as the NJAC title. His totals for 2005 were, 102 tackles (55 solo), including 21.5 tackles for loss (-133 yards) with 13 QB sacks (106 yards). Tosh also forced seven fumbles, broke up four passes and returned his interception for five yards.

Fairlie, a senior, from Broomall, Pennsylvania, twice was named Middle Atlantic Conference Defensive Player of the Week. He earned his first honor with a forced fumble and recovery, interception to set-up the go-ahead touchdown and recovery of onside kick at Lebanon Valley (9/24). He won his second award with eight tackles, two interceptions (one setting up the game-winning field goal) and two fumble recoveries with one at Widener's one yard line at Salisbury (11/5). He was also a Player of the Week for the Football Gazette. Fairlie easily led Widener with 123 tackles and five interceptions and had seven games with at least 10 tackles. He totaled 123 tackles (76 solo), three tackles for loss (-3 yards), one forced fumble, three fumble recoveries, 12 pass breakups and intercepted five passes for 108 return yards. He helped Widener defeat Montclair State in the ECAC Southwest Championship game, 27-18.

Gonzalez, a junior, from Meridian, Connecticut, is a First-Team ECAC and First Team New Jersey Athletic Conference selection. For the 2005 season, Gonzalez returned 25 punts for 349 yards (14.0 yards per return) and his two kickoff returns he carried back for a total of 123 yards, including one for 100 yards and a touchdown. On offense, at his wide receiver slot, he caught 55 passes for 625 yards (11.4 average per catch) and three touchdowns, while also rushing for 28 yards on five carries (5.6 yards per carry) and one more score. He even punted once for 30 yards and a touchback. Gonzalez totaled 1,125 all-purpose yards for the 2005 season.

John Audino, who led his team to the Liberty League football title and into the second-round of the NCAA Div. III playoffs where they lost to Rowan, 28-24, also guided his troops to an 11-1 record in 2005. In his 14 seasons at Union, Coach John Audino has a record of 108-98 with four appearances in the NCAA Division III national tournament and four Eastern College Athletic Conference Northwest Championship titles. He is the first coach to win 100 games in Union football history. The 2005 season featured a perfect 10-0 regular season, the ninth undefeated season in school history. Union won the Liberty League title with a 7-0 mark.
