Carroll's Emmert, Baker, Shirley, Morningside's Johnson and Graceland's Hepburn Highlight 2005 *Football Gazette* All-American Team

WESTMONT, Illinois -- NAIA Player of the Year, **Tyler Emmert**, **Rimington Award winner, **Kyle Baker** and defensive standout **Jeff Shirley**, all from Carroll, along with Morningside's record setting receiver, **Trae Johnson**, and outstanding defensive back **Roshe Hepburn**, from Graceland headline a talented 2005 *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* NAIA All-America team. Carroll College's, **Mike Van Diest**, who led his Saints' to a fourth consecutive NAIA national championship, including a 14-0 record, was named Coach of the Year.

Emmert earned Offensive Back of the Year honors, Shirley was chosen Defensive Lineman of the Year, while Baker was the beneficiary of the Co-Offensive Lineman of the year as well as the recipient of the Rimington Award (**See Below). Johnson claimed the Offensive Receiver of the Year Award and Hepburn is the Defensive Back of the Year. Senior **Stephen Holte** from Azusa Pacific University earned Linebacker of the Year status, while **Micah Cravalho** from Evangel University claimed Special Teams player of the Year honors. **Josh Epperly**, from Dickinson State is the other Co-Offensive Lineman of the Year.

Emmert, from Helena, Montana, is a three-time First Team NAIA coach's All-American selection. The 2005 Rawlings-NAIA Player of the Year wrapped up his four-year career with an NAIA-record 13,980 yards of total offense. Emmert's 2005 stats include, 258-of-392 pass completions (65.8-percent) for 3,317 yards and 35 touchdowns with seven interceptions. He also rushed for 186 yards on 65 carries and scored five rushing touchdowns. Emmert was a unanimous First Team pick by the Football Gazette A-A committee (one of only two unanimous choices). Not enough can be said about this amazing football player, his leadership capabilities on-and-off the playing field is remarkable. I'm sure his future will be notable.

Baker, a senior, from Coeur d'Alene, Idaho, is the 2005 **Rimington Award recipient and was both a First-Team NAIA athletic and academic All-American in 2004 and '05. Baker was a unanimous First Team pick by the Football Gazette A-A committee (one of only two unanimous choices). He has lettered all four years at Carroll College. Carroll won the national championship each year, and totaled an overall 53-4 record. Baker started in all but one of those 57 games.

Epperly, a senior, from Hettinger, North Dakota is an NAIA Football Coaches Association First Team pick for 2005 as well as a two-time Offensive Lineman "Player of the year" selection by the Football Gazette as well as 2004 First Team All-American pick by the Football Gazette. Epperly is a Three-time First team All Dakota Athletic Conference choice; was a 2004 NAIA Second Team All-American; and is the number two ranked player in the DAC for second consecutive season

Shirley, a senior, from Stockett, Montana, is the Frontier Conference Defensive Player of the Year and a First Team NAIA All-American in 2005. He totaled 67 tackles, including 15 tackles for loss (68.8 yards) with 11.8 QB sacks (61.7 yards) Shirley also had one forced fumble while helping Carroll College win their fourth straight NAIA title in 2005. Only one other school has ever won four consecutive championships. Augustana (IL) College accomplished that feat in NCAA Division III from 1984-87.

Johnson, a senior, from San Bernardino, California, a Second Team NAIA All-American, as chosen by the NAIA coaches, and a First Team Great Plains Athletic Conference selection caught 81 passes for school-record totals of 1,910 yards and 21 touchdowns. He averaged 23.6 yards per catch and was the NAIA national leader with an average of 146.9 reception yards per game. He also established new Morningside single-season records with 22 touchdowns and 132 points scored

Hepburn, a sophomore, from Orlando, Florida, is a first team NAIA All-American selection and received the most votes of any defensive back in the country. At six-feet, 180-pounds, Hepburn made 98 total tackles, 50 of which were solos. As a sophomore, Hepburn had seven interceptions, 12 pass break ups, three forced fumbles and two tackles for loss. Hepburn ended the season ranked eighth in the country in interceptions per game and fumbles forced per game and was number 32 in passes defended per game. Hepburn was also the top defensive back vote getter for the Football Gazette.

Holte, a senior, from West Des Moines, Iowa is a first team NAIA All-American selection. Playing in 10 games during the 2005 season, Holte totaled a notable 137 tackles, including 14 tackles for loss (42 yards) with 6.5 sacks (33 yards). He also created two fumbles and recovered two. Holte also intercepted three passes with 68 return yards and broke up six other pass attempts. He was the top defensive vote recipient among all defensive players (regardless of position) for the Football Gazette.

Cravalho, from Honoka'a, Hawaii, is a First Team All-Heart of America Athletic Conference kick returner and ranked No. 1 in the NAIA for punt returns in 2005. Cravalho set new school records with four punt return touchdowns this season and a total of five in his career; he also set new school records for season punt return yards (518), season punt return average (23.5), and career punt return yards (711). He returned 22 kickoffs for 443 yards (20.1 average per return). Cravalho is a 2005 First Team NAIA Punt return selection.

This marks the 18th year *Don Hansen's Football Gazette*, a recognized authority on small college football has selected an NAIA All-America team. A total of 10 members make up the *Football Gazette* NAIA All-American Selection Committee (eight Sports Information Directors and two Football Gazette personnel).

Mike Van Diest guided his football combatants to a 14-0 mark this season and their fourth-consecutive NAIA National Title. They are the only NAIA team ever to win four national titles in a row. They are also only one of two schools at any level to win four consecutive national titles. The other was Division III Augustana, Ill. which accomplished the feat from 1983-1986. Under the leadership of Coach Van Diest the Saints have posted a 78-16 record during the past six seasons. This includes a 47-9 Frontier Conference record for a winning percentage of .839. The Fighting Saints have earned six straight Final Four appearances in the NAIA national playoffs.

The Rimington Trophy website is located at <http://www.rimingtontrophy.com> Esiason, a high-octane Maryland quarterback, and Rimington, a nonpareil center for Nebraska, were NFL teammates at Cincinnati in the mid-1980s. In 1993, Esiason created the New York City based foundation that bears his name to raise funds for the treatment and research of cystic fibrosis.
