Linfield's Elliott and Allen, Thiel's Hendricks and St. John's Dumonceaux Highlight 2005 Football Gazette All-American Team

WESTMONT, Illinois -- Gagliardi and Melberger award recipient **Brett Elliott**, from Linfield and record-setting receiver and teammate, **Casey Allen**, along with Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference Defensive Player of the Year, **Damien Dumonceaux** from Saint John's and, Thiel's two-time President's Athletic Conference First-Team selection, **Dave Hendricks** headline a talented 2005 *Don Hansen's Football Gazette NCAA Division III All-America team*. Wisconsin-Whitewater's **Bob Berezowitz** was named National Coach of the Year after leading the Warhawks to the NCAA Div. III Championship game for the first time in their NCAA Division III history and an overall record of 14-1 for the season.

Elliott was acknowledged the Offensive Back of the Year, while Allen claimed the Offensive Receiver of the Year Award and Dumonceaux was awarded Defensive Lineman of the Year. Hendricks was affirmed the Offensive Lineman of the Year. Senior **Tom Anthony** from Augustana College earned Defensive Back of the Year Kudos, while **Lenny Radtke** from North Central College picked up the Linebacker of the Year award. Ohio Northern's **Wesley Hostetler** received the Special Teams Player of the Year honor and Offensive Center **Damien Ciecwisz** from Delaware Valley is the 2005 recipient of the *Rimington Award* as the NCAA Div. III top offensive center.** (See below)

Elliott, a senior, from Lake Oswego, Oregon, is the 2005 Gagliardi Trophy and Melberger Award recipient. The Northwest Conference Player of the Year and a First team All-America by the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA). Also a third team Little Associated Press All-American and Football Gazette First Team and all-West Regional Offensive Back of the Year. Elliott set Linfield career passing record with 8,614 yards, tied NCAA Division III record for most 300-yard passing games in one season (9) and ranked second in Division III in passing efficiency, He threw for 49 TDs in leading Linfield to a 10-1 record. In 2005 he completed 277-of-396 passes (69.9 percent) for 4,019 yards and 49 touchdowns. Elliott also rushed for 69 yards on 27 carries (2.6 average per carry) and scored one touchdown.

Allen, a senior, from Newport, Oregon, was named to the Northwest Conference First Team and Football Gazette First Team and all-West Regional Offensive Receiver of the Year.. He set Linfield career receiving records for yards (3,550), catches (219) and touchdowns (59) and set Linfield single-season receiving records for yards (1,410), catches (90) and touchdowns (23) in 2004. Allen caught 78 passes for 1,314 yards and 22 TDs as a senior in 2005 and caught a school-record four TD passes three times.

Dumonceaux, a senior, from St. Joseph, Minnesota, a two-sport athlete at SJU (football, track/field) is a Biology/Math major with a GPA of 3.475. Dumonceaux was the Johnnie defensive spark all season as he finished the season leading the team with 78 tackles (48 solo, 30 assisted). He was second in tackles for loss with 17.5/88 yards lost and in sacks with 9.0/66 yards lost. Dumonceaux also notched two quarterback hurries and led the team with four blocked kicks. Dumonceaux was named to the All-MIAC First Team, was named the MIAC Defensive Lineman of the Year (MIAC STAM AWARD) , was recently named to the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District V College Division Football Team, and was a finalist for the 2005 Gagliardi Trophy. Damien Dumonceaux was selected to play in the AFCA 2005 Aztec Bowl. Dumonceaux is a member of the SJU Biology Club and Math Club. Dumonceaux is a First Team Football Gazette all-West Region and Defensive Lineman of the Year.

Hendricks, a senior, from Rockton, Pennsylvania, is a two-time all-Presidents' Athletic Conference (PAC) first-team selection, helped the Tomcats finish the 2005 season with an 11-1 mark, won their first PAC title since 1972 and made their first-ever appearance in the NCAA Division III playoffs. Hendricks, who started 44 total games during his career, anchored an offensive line that helped Thiel average more than 400 yards of total offense per game this season. Besides the AP Little All-American award, Hendricks was named to the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Division III All-America Team. Hendricks is a First Team Football Gazette all-South Region and Offensive Lineman of the Year honoree.

Anthony, a Senior, from Bettendorf, Iowa, is the CCIW conference Defensive Player of the Year. He led NCAA Div. III in interceptions with 13. His totals for the year were, 42 tackles (33 solo), two tackles for loss (-5 yards), one forced fumble, eight pass breakups. With his 13 interceptions he had 169 return yards, including one for a touchdown. Anthony achieved First Team Football Gazette all-North Region and Defensive Back of the Year honors.

Radtke, a senior, from Carol Stream, Illinois, is an American Football Coaches Association First Team pick for 2005. He is also a First Team Football Gazette all-North Region and Defensive Linebacker of the Year claimant. He was also a pre-season First Team pick by many publications. Radtke is a CCIW All-Conference First Team selection for the third straight year after leading his team in tackles with 152 (73 solo, 79 assisted), 12 tackles for a loss of 35 yards, two sacks for a loss of 15 yards, two interceptions returned for 25 yards, 13 pass breakups, two forced fumbles and two blocked kicks (both returned for touchdowns) and helped lead team to NCAA III Playoffs for first time in school history.

Hostetler, a senior, from Strasburg, Ohio, a First Team Ohio Athletic Conference pick, returned 13 kickoffs for 409 yards (31.5 yards per return), including one for a score, and had 30 punt returns for 467 yards (15.6 yards per return), including two for touchdowns. On defense he totaled 63 tackles (47 solo hits), including 5.5 tackles for loss (-17 yards) with one sack for minus -12 yards. Hostetler also broke up eight passes and returned his five interceptions for a total of 36 yards. He is also a First Team Football Gazette Defensive Back in 2005. Hostetler was voted the MVP in Team USA's win over the Mexican All-Stars in the Aztec Bowl on Dec. 17, 2005. Hostetler is a First Team Football Gazette all-North Region and Region Special Teams Player of the Year.

Bob Berezowitz led his players to the best mark in school history (14-1) and to the title game of the NCAA Division III playoffs. Just completing his twenty-first year as a collegiate head coach, all at UW-Whitewater, Berezowitz is 145-71-4, a winning percentage of .668. Berezowitz was selected 2005 WIAC Football Coach of the Year. He is ranked second in games won among Whitewater football coaches. Berezowitz was a standout quarterback during his days with the Warhawks. He still has two school records and is tied for first in two others. He guided the Warhawks to a second place finish in America in 1966 when Whitewater played Waynesburg, PA in the NAIA championship game. During his standout year of 1966, Berezowitz was selected Associated Press Small College All-American. Berezowitz continued his football career in the Central United States Football League (semi-professional football), being named the MVP of the league in 1968. Berezowitz was not only a star quarterback but he was selected as an all-American in baseball as a catcher while at Whitewater. He had opportunities to sign professional baseball contracts but decided to become a coach instead. During his tenure at Whitewater his teams have always been in title contention winning six conference championships. UW-W football players have earned a total of 51 all-American honors (not including those from 2005) as well as numerous all-conference honors under Berezowitz's tenure.

Ciecwisz, a senior from Northampton, Pennsylvania, has earned the 2005 ** Rimington Trophy for his outstanding play at offensive center. He is a 2005 Middle Atlantic Conference First Team All-Star. Also, a First Team Football Gazette All-South Region. Delaware Valley was ranked in the top 50 nationally in scoring (34.6 average), total offense (491.0 average), rushing (227.2 average) and passing (263.8 average). Ciecwisz helped his team reach the quarterfinals, before falling to Rowan 27-21, and a final team overall record of 12-1 along with the championship of the MAC with a perfect 9-0 mark.

This marks the 18th year *Don Hansen's Football Gazette*, a recognized authority on small college football has selected an NCAA III All-America team. A total of 186 players have earned some form of *Football Gazette* All-America Accolades.

The Rimington Trophy website is located at <http://www.rimingtontrophy.com> Esiason, a high-octane Maryland quarterback, and Rimington, a nonpareil center for Nebraska, were NFL teammates at Cincinnati in the mid-1980s. In 1993, Esiason created the New York City based foundation that bears his name to raise funds for the treatment and research of cystic fibrosis.
