Alma's Brehm, Mount Union's Garcon, DePauw's Hertel, and St. John Fisher's Lang Highlight 2006 *Football Gazette* All- American Team

WESTMONT, Illinois -- Gagliardi Trophy award recipient **Josh Brehm**, from Alma College, the OAC's "Most Outstanding Receiver", from Mount Union, **Pierre Garcon**, along with Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference defensive Player of the Year, **Dustin Hertel**, from DePauw University, and St. John Fisher's, Empire 8 Conference Defensive Player of the Year, **Gene Lang**, headline a talented 2006 *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* NCAA Division III All-America team. Saint John Fisher College's **Paul Vosburgh** was named National Coach of the Year after leading the Cardinals to the NCAA Div. III Championship Playoffs, including to the semifinals before losing to the eventual National Champion, Mount Union.

Brehm was announced as the Offensive Back of the Year, while Garcon garnered the Offensive Receiver of the Year Award and Hertel was proclaimed Defensive Lineman of the Year. Lang was confirmed the Linebacker of the Year. Junior **Lindy Crea**, from Hartwick College earned the Special Teams Player of the Year Award, while **Brandon Carr** from Bethel (MN) University picked up the Defensive Back of the Year award. UW Whitewater's **Max Sakellaris** was chosen Offensive Lineman of the Year, and Offensive Center **Josh Knox** from Hardin-Simmons University is the 2006 recipient of the *Rimington Award* as the NCAA Div. III top offensive center.** (See below)

Brehm, a senior, from Ithaca, Michigan, is the 2006 Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association Offensive MVP and the 2006 winner of the Gagliardi Trophy presented by Josten's to the Player of The Year in NCAA Division III. He led the NCAA in three categories, including total offense (4,084 yards), passing yards (3,448 yards) and passing yards per game (344.8 average). Tied an NCAA record by passing for 300 yards nine times this season, and has 21 career 300-yard passing games. Set NCAA record with 10 consecutive 300-yard total offense games this season, has 25 career 300-yard total offense games. Had eight consecutive games without an interception (set NCAA record with 288 pass attempts without an interception). Had 25 games with over 300 yards of total offense (10 consecutive this season). Led team to school records this season in passing yards (3,448), pass completions (305), touchdown passes (30) and points scored (382). Selected to participate in East Coast Bowl all-star game, Brehm completed 20-of-28 passes for 240 yards and one touchdown, while also rushing for a score. In 2006 he completed 305-of-462 passes (66.0 percent) for 3,448 yards and 30 touchdowns while being intercepted just three times. Brehm also rushed for 636 yards on 154 carries (4.1 yards per carry) and scored nine touchdowns.

Garcon, a junior, from West Palm Beach, Florida, was named the OAC's "Most Outstanding Receiver" for 2006. He is also an AFCA First Team All-American in 2006. He helped lead Mount Union to a perfect 15-0 record, plus the Raiders second straight Div. III National title, and Mount Unions ninth overall. Garcon caught 67 passes for 1,212 yards (18.1 yards per catch) and scored 17 touchdowns. He also had seven carries for 106 yards and two more scores, while returning three punts for 49 yards (16.3 average yards per return).

Hertel a senior, from Batesville, Indiana, is the Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference Defensive player of the year. Hertel set a school and SCAC record single-season tackles for loss (27.5) and tied SCAC and set DePauw single-season record for sacks (16) in 2006. He ranks second in NCAA Division III for tackles for loss, third for sacks and fourth in forced fumbles. His complete stats for 2006 are, 85 total tackles, including 27.5 tackles for loss (-155 yards) with 16 sacks (-120 yards). Hertel also caused five fumbles, recovered three, had three pass breakups, returned his interception 15 yards for a touchdown and blocked a field goal attempt.

Lang, a senior, from Baldwinsville, New York, is the 2006 Empire 8 Conference Defensive Player of the Year, and a First Team All-Empire 8 selection. Lang, an inside linebacker, led the Fisher defense, which set a College-record for shutouts in a season with five, with 147 tackles – 59 more than any other player. His 147 stops are the second-highest in Fisher history and the 16th-highest season-total in NCAA Division III history. His total stats for 2006 are as follows, 147 tackles (67 solo), including 23 tackles for loss (-58 yards) with three sacks (-20 yards). Lang also caused three fumbles, recovered four fumbles, broke up three passes and made one interception.

Crea, a junior, from Binghamton, New York, is a two-time First-Team Empire 8 selection. He led the nation in all-purpose yards per game with a 215.1 average. He rushed for 1,087 yards on 177 carries (6.1 yards per carry) and scored 11 touchdowns, caught 28 passes for 716 yards (18.8 yards per reception and scored four touchdowns, while also returning 19 kickoffs, averaging 18.3 yards per return.

Brandon Carr, a senior, from Fergus Falls, Minnesota, was a first-team all-conference selection, including receiving the most votes at his position. Carr led the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference in interceptions, was second in pass breakups and was third on the team in tackles. He is a three-time MIAC Player of the Week. His totals for the 2006 season were, 59 tackles, including two for four yards in losses. Carr also broke up 15 passes and had seven interceptions for 151 yards, including one returned for a touchdown.

Sakellaris, a senior, from Oak Park, Illinois, is a three-time, first-team, all-conference pick. He helped UW-Whitewater average 36.1 points per game. Average 225.5 yards of passing offense per game, 177.7 yards rushing per game and 403.2 total offensive yards per game. A menacing presence on the offensive line, he was one of the outstanding factors that allowed the Warhawks to accumulate a 42-8 record over the past four years, including going 28-2 the past two falls.

This marks the 19th year *Don Hansen's Football Gazette*, a recognized authority on small college football, has selected an NCAA III All-America team. A total of 230 players have earned some form of *Football Gazette* All-America recognition.

Paul Vosburgh, who led his team to the Empire 8 Conference co-title, in what is arguably the toughest conference overall at present, and to the semi-finals of the NCAA Division III playoffs, where his fledglings bowed out to the eventual National Champion, Mount Union, 26-14, while finishing the 2006 season with a 12-2 overall record. This was his fourth straight season making a post-season appearance. He accepted a position as head coach and athletic director at DeSales Catholic where he began his high school playing days in 1978 and went to William Penn, where he was the defensive coordinator for two seasons and head coach for his final three seasons. After three seasons as defensive coordinator at Division II Emporia State College, he returned to New York and accepted his current position as the seventh head coach in St. John Fisher College football history.

Knox, a Senior, from Snyder, Texas, has earned the 2006 ** Rimington Trophy for his outstanding play at offensive center. He was named the American Southwest Conference Offensive Lineman of the Year and was selected a first team American Football Coaches Association All-American. He paved the way for an offense that averaged 40.6 points per game and 463.8 total yards per game. Knox was also selected to play in the Aztec Bowl.,
